Sick leave in patients with chronic whiplash associated disorders (WAD) is an important problem for society. 15-30% Of the patients continue to experience

serious symptoms after the first six months. Pain related disability is a complex multidimensional construct, influence by biological, psychological and social factors. Valid measurement of disability is challenging. Self reported disability and performance based disability are assumed to be related which each other but distinct. However, this has not been tested in patients with WAD.
